### What is this product?

#### Type

This product is a share of an investment company qualifying as an undertaking for collective investment in transferable securities (UCITS).

#### Term

This sub-fund has no maturity date. However, the manufacturer may decide to close the sub-fund under certain circumstances.

#### Objectives

The sub-fund may expose its assets to UCITS or other equity, bond or money-market investment funds and/or ETFs and/or financial contracts traded on regulated markets or over-the-counter (it being noted that the use of such financial contracts may only be made on an ancillary basis).

The sub-fund will be exposed up to:

- 30% to 80% of its net assets to UCITS or other investment funds and/or ETFs and/or equity derivatives, including emerging markets, without any sector or geographical area constraints;
- from 10% to 70% of its net assets in UCITS or other investment funds and/or ETFs and/or bond derivatives, including emerging markets, without any sector or geographical area constraints (including in emerging countries), including high yield and/or distressed bonds. The total exposure of the sub-fund to UCIs/UCITS specialised in high yield and/or distressed bonds may be a maximum aggregate of 30% of its net assets (it being understood that exposure to distressed bonds alone may not exceed 10% of the sub-fund's net assets);
- up to 60% of its net assets in UCITS or other investment funds and/or ETFs and/or derivatives implementing diversified investment strategies;
- up to 40% of its net assets in UCIs/UCITS and/or money-market ETFs;
- up to 20% of its net assets in UCITS or other investment funds implementing alternative management or absolute return strategies;
- up to 20% of its net assets in issuers based in China;
- up to 10% of its net assets in UCIs/UCITS investing in contingent convertible bonds;
- up to 10% of its net assets in UCIs/UCITS exposed to securitisation instruments, including but not limited to Asset Backed Securities, or ABS, Mortgage-Backed Securities, or MBS, Collateralized Mortgage Obligations, or CMO, Collateralized Debt Obligations, or CDO and Collateralized Loan Obligations, or CLO;
- up to 10% of its net assets in UCIs/UCITS investing in catastrophe bonds (CAT Bonds);
- up to 10% of its net assets in UCIs/UCITS that may be indirectly exposed to commodities.

The sub-fund may use all listed derivatives to gain exposure or for hedging purposes (all asset classes of futures: equities, rates, foreign exchange) as well as exchange futures and exchange swaps.

The sub-fund may be exposed to the exchange risk within the limit of 100% of its net assets.

The sub-fund is subject to the first paragraph of Article 8 of the SFDR as it

promotes a set of ESG characteristics. Management is particularly focused on environmental, social and/or governance (ESG) criteria. In accordance with the SFDR RTS regulation, further information on ESG characteristics is available in the SFDR appendix relating to the sub-fund. The objective of the sub-fund's ESG strategy is to identify investment opportunities, by identifying UCIs that either promote environmental/social characteristics (Article 8 SFDR fund) or have a sustainable investment objective (Article 9 SFDR fund), and that post strong non-financial performances. It also aims to detect non-financial risks that could transform into a financial risk. The managers select UCIs that have passed a proprietary ESG filter that aims to ensure a minimum sustainability quality. These UCIs will account for at least 80% of the sub-fund's net assets.

**Benchmark:** The portfolio is actively managed on a discretionary basis without reference to a benchmark.

#### Intended retail investor

The sub-fund is particularly suitable for investors with a medium to long-term investment horizon and who wish to benefit from the performance of the bond and stock markets. Investors should be aware that investments in high yield and emerging market bonds are not excluded. The investor must be prepared to accept moderate short-term capital losses due to fluctuations in bond prices.

#### Other information

**Depository:** Banque et Caisse d'Epargne de l'Etat, Luxembourg

**Dividend income:** This class is a capitalisation class meaning that income is reinvested.

**Conversion right:** The investor has the right to convert his investment in shares of one sub-fund into shares of the same sub-fund or another sub-fund. The investor can obtain information about how to convert in the prospectus of the fund.

**Segregation:** The assets and liabilities of a sub-fund are segregated pursuant to the law so that the commitments and liabilities of one sub-fund do not affect the other sub-funds.

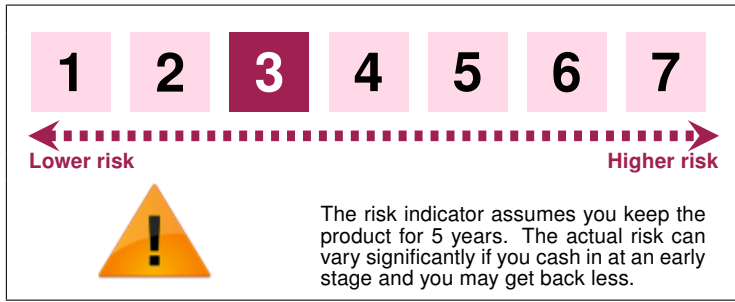

## What happens if Spuerkeess Asset Management S.A. is unable to pay out?

If we are not able to pay you out what we owe you, you are not covered by any national compensation or guarantee scheme. To protect you, the assets are held with a separate company, the depositary Banque et Caisse d'Epargne de l'Etat, Luxembourg. Should we default, the investments are liquidated and the proceeds are distributed to the investors. In the worst case, however, you could lose your entire investment.

## What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

### Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding period we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario

## How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

### Recommended holding period: 5 years

You should be prepared to stay invested for 5 years. However, you can redeem your investment without penalty at any time during this time, or hold the investment longer. Redemptions are possible on each full bank business day in Luxembourg. In exceptional circumstances, your right to request the redemption of your investment may be limited or suspended.
